Aims and objectives

Our policy on school uniform is based on the belief that school uniform:

- promotes a sense of pride in our school;
- helps to create a sense of community and belonging towards the school;
- identifies the children with the school;
- supports our commitment to inclusion;
- is practical, smart and designed with health and safety in mind;
- is considered good value for money by most parents;

Expectations

We expect all pupils to comply with this uniform policy, which will be monitored.

The Role of Parents We believe that one of the responsibilities of parents is to ensure that their child has the correct uniform and PE kit, and that it is clean, in good repair and that the child's name is written on all items.

The Role of Governors

The governing body supports the Headteacher in implementing the School Uniform Policy. It considers all representations from parents regarding the uniform policy and liaises with the Headteacher to ensure that the policy is implemented fairly and with sensitivity. It is the governors'

responsibility to ensure that the school uniform meets all regulations concerning equal opportunities. Governors ensure that the school Uniform Policy enables children to dress sensibly, in clothing that is hardwearing, safe and practical.

Where to buy School uniform

At Talavera Infant School there is no expectation for parents to purchase Branded school jumpers/cardigans or PE t-shirts. If parents would like Branded items, they can either be purchased from Edgar Jerome, or obtained for free from the half termly second-hand uniform events. Unbranded uniform can also be bought from most major stores at competitive prices.

School Uniform List

- Red sweatshirt/jumper or red cardigan (logo or no logo)
 - Grey long trousers
 - Grey skirt or pinafore dress
- White or red polo shirts long or short sleeved
 - White/dark socks or tights
 - Black shoes (no trainers)
 - Grey shorts/long trousers
 - Red checked dress
 - Black shoes
- White or dark socks or tights

P.E. Kit

- Black or dark colour shorts (no logo)
- Plain white or red t-shirt (logo or no logo)
- For winter months black or dark joggers and sweatshirt (no logo)
 - Trainers

Headscarves/Hijab These may be worn for religious reasons but must be in a school colour such as grey, white or black.

Jewellery It is not appropriate for children to wear jewellery except a sensible watch and a pair of small plain stud earrings.

School Bags Please ensure your child has a book bag which is slightly larger than A4 size which they can bring reading books to school in (logo or no logo). If you would like logo items, please purchase from Edgar Jerome in Aldershot Town Centre. There is no reason for children to bring large bags into school. There is a great shortage of space in the cloakrooms and large bags exacerbate the problem. Lunch boxes can be carried and stored on trolleys.
